



FIRST RESPONSE BROADCASTER PIV-I CARD: APPROVAL FROM STATION MANAGER

The Nevada Broadcasters Association presents this member exclusive program providing safety training and FEMA certified PIV-I card credentialing, to television and radio engineers, with approval from the station manager. PIV-I card credentialing is exclusive to engineering personnel. The purpose of the card is so engineers can pass through police and fire lines to access their studios and transmitter facilities, during an emergency or natural disaster. This access can be critical for broadcasters to communicate important information from emergency officials to the public.

If a person who is issued a PIV-I card leaves the employment of the station, the Station Manager or designee is asked to collect the card and return to the NVBA. By signing below, the Station Manager accepts responsibility for proper use of the First Response Broadcaster PIV-I card, along with certifying that the below names are covered by the stations' Liability Insurance Policy. They further agree to hold harmless the Nevada Broadcasters Association and its staff for any damage or injury that may occur. Independent contractors must show proof of Liability Insurance and list all stations they are contracted for.
